Murrumbeena Park play space



Glen Eira City Council is currently finalising a proposed play space project at Murrumbeena Park on Kangaroo Road.

The proposal sees the removal of the existing playground adjacent to the main sports oval and the creation of a new play space in the eastern side of the park. The design incorporates a number of leading edge components and treatments which will make the playspace a model for future developments.

The design goes beyond any existing playground and merges traditional play equipment with interactive landscaping, family picnic areas, tree plantings and facilities. It provides areas from toddlers to more active adolescents and can be accessed by wheelchairs and prams.

In January, the Victorian Government announced a grant of \$258,921 to assist in the construction of the Murrumbeena play space as part of Sport and Recreation Victoria's *Community Facility Funding Program*.

The project is listed as an item for consideration as part of Council's 2012–13 Budget.

An opportunity to view the plans will be available at Murrumbeena Park Pavilion, Kangaroo Road on Thursday 24 May from 6.30pm to 7.30pm. This will include a brief presentation by the play space designer and Council officers will be available to clarify any issues and answer any questions.

Four-year-old kindergarten 2014 enrolment reminder

Glen Eira City Council operates a central enrolment system for 13 community based kindergartens within the municipality.

Parents wanting their child to attend four-year-old kindergarten in 2014 are reminded that enrolments open on 1 May 2012.

Children whose birth dates fall between 1 May 2009 and 30 April 2010 are eligible to attend kindergarten in 2014.

Applications are taken in date of receipt order from 1 May 2012. Applications will not be accepted prior to 1 May 2012.

Enrolment forms are available from your local kindergarten, online at www.gleneira.vic.gov.au or by contacting Council's Service Centre on 9524 3333. An application fee of \$17 applies.

Three-year-old kindergarten enrolments are taken directly by the kindergartens and do not influence when enrolling for four-year-old kindergarten.

Please note: Kindergarten programs are also offered in community and privately owned long day care centres, early learning centres, and kindergarten centres. Families interested in securing places in those services should contact them directly.
